I never imagined ourselves needing help, but you were there when we needed it most

When my contract ended, I was lucky enough to find another short-term teaching position. Ready for my new job, I drove my 18-month old daughter Sophie to my home child care provider's house like I did every morning. But when I got there, she refused to care for Sophie any longer now that I only needed her help on a part-time basis. With my reduced salary, we could no longer afford full-time care.

I felt so hurt and helpless. Standing on her doorstep with Sophie in my arms, I pleaded with her to help us out just until I could find another child care provider. But she simply turned us away. As she closed the door on us, I started to cry.

It was as though my world instantly fell apart. I was distraught and frantic. Who was going to look after Sophie while my husband and I were at work? We're a young family, just starting out and barely making ends meet. Not working wasn't an option for us. How were we ever going to afford the cost of child care?

Then I remembered the YMCA. My husband had been donating to the YMCA Strong Kids campaign for years and I knew that they

helped families in times of need. So I reached out for help. Lorraine and Lisa at the YMCA were so understanding and compassionate, they assured me they would do everything they could to help.

Within a couple of days, they had not only found a place for Sophie in their preschool child care program, but thanks to the support of donors to the YMCA Strong Kids campaign, we were able to receive financial assistance which made it affordable for us.

Every day Sophie is surrounded by little friends to play with and teachers who are helping my little girl develop into this amazing little person.

My husband has always been a strong believer in the work of the YMCA and has supported their cause for years, but we never imagined ourselves needing their help. But in reality, there are times when we all need support. I'm so grateful to the staff at the YMCA and to the donors who give so generously to the YMCA Strong Kids campaign each year.
